Calw. On Good Friday, 22 April, from 7 p.m. in the Calwer Stadtkirche an organ concert with district cantor Martin W. Hagner.

Good Friday is the day of remembrance of the suffering and death of Jesus Christ and the highest holiday of Protestant Christianity. It was celebrated musically and this day will be spread over two

different types: either very reserved with simple songs or on very artistic way to take the importance into account.

Especially in the Middle Ages Artistic music, the so-called figural music, was forbidden on Good Friday. Many instruments, all especially trumpets and timpani, were not allowed, even

The organ was not played, so the congregation sing their songs unaccompanied had to.
