## "Phoenix Daughter": Isabelle Müller presented her latest book

Kapfenhardt-based author Isabelle Müller has published her latest book. Her autobiography, "Phoenix Daughter," was published in mid-March by Krüger Verlag in Frankfurt am Main.

From her, I learned to discover something hopeful in moments of deep despair, to see obstacles as something that can be overcome." At the same time, it is a ruthless reckoning with the dominant and brutal father who humiliated his daughter for so many years. Above all, however, the book is encouraging, as Isabelle Müller shows how she learned to cope with her pain in order to overcome life's next hurdles with renewed strength.
