However, there was a brutal father and habitat with a racist spirit, but Isabelle inherited the living and courageous power towards the future from her Vietnamese mother.

Isabelle Müller's story is not only about finding happiness but also about the way to find it. It is about turning unhappiness into happiness, learning how to turn the negative spiral into a positive spiral. Whether she "has certainly experienced bad things, including sexual abuse, psychological terrorism, exhaustion, exclusion, discrimination, poverty, betrayal", but In return, she always told herself: "I have also experienced true love, warmth, affection, willingness to help, empathy, friendship, luck and happiness. And I am allowed to live healthy here on earth and enjoy this life." It can be seen that, despite having gone through the worst years, being sexually abused by their own relatives, suffering, being dumb, unable to tell anyone, living in despair for many years ... it was the ultimate pain that Isabelle suffered; but she did not surrender to adversity, tried to rise up and inspire people. Their silence to break the power of the culprit. For three and a half years, Isabelle Müller has spoken 150 times in eight federal states in front of an audience, a guest on television and radio, and was invited to the Federal President for her commitment.

The story of Isabelle Müller's life gives readers a lot of strength, hope, positive and courageous life force for everyone, especially girls who have been sexually abused, discriminated against. behave. It will encourage people to ask questions many times about things in life and themselves to conquer their own fears, believe in one's dreams, especially when they are said to be inaccessible. reach out to others, develop your own confidence. And even though she experienced the event, the tribulation, Isabelle was still optimistic, positive about what she had been building, "With our anger and hatred breaking everything, but with Our patience and love can build a temple from nothingness." This also implies forgiveness. The power of forgiveness can do wonders, "the attitude of life makes all". The pain may be eternal, the scar deep in the heart, but forgiveness

is the decision to free and save for both me and me.

Isabelle Müller was born on May 25, 1964 in Tours (France), the youngest child in a family of 5 children. Her mother is Vietnamese and her father is French, growing up in poor conditions in a small French village. After graduating from high school, she studied languages (Germany, England and Russia) at Francois Rabelais University (Tours, France) and at the Center déEtudes Pratiques de Langes Vivantes (Tours, France). Since 1985, she has worked in Germany as an interpreter and translator. Along with her mother, Ms. Yuan Thi Cuc (Self Loan), Isabelle Müller made trips to Southeast Asia in the 1990s to learn about her Vietnamese roots.

In May 2016, the author founded the LOAN Stiftung Charity Foundation, which specializes in educational projects for ethnic minority children in the poorest mountains of Northern Vietnam. The entire amount received from the book copyright, the author will donate 100% to the LOAN Foundation (LOAN Stiftung) to help poor Vietnamese children lead a better life. The book will be released in Germany, Europe, Canada, and the United States at the FUN BOOK. In addition, the FUNCTION POLICY system also decided to extract a portion of the profits from the sale of this book to the gift of the LOAN (LOAN Sitftung) fund founded by Isabelle to help poor children in Vietnam.
