While her family was most in trouble, Isabelle Müller devoted her love to sharing and supporting schooling for children until she was 18 years old. Now the City house didn't have to eat the swallow anymore but the meal was fuller, bought cows, had motorbikes take them to school.



Not only helping the Thanh family, but the Loan Foundation, founded by Isabelle Muller and the Chief Representative, has been accompanied by more than 2,000 disadvantaged children.

Hundreds of scholarships and thousands of books have been awarded by the Loan Foundation to students in the mountainous provinces of the North, Vietnam, especially with meaningful activity of construction.
